There were some mighty big questions that came up in 1980-81 — mighty big. Some of them were answered; some were not. Some probably never will be. Future historians will record some of the answers.



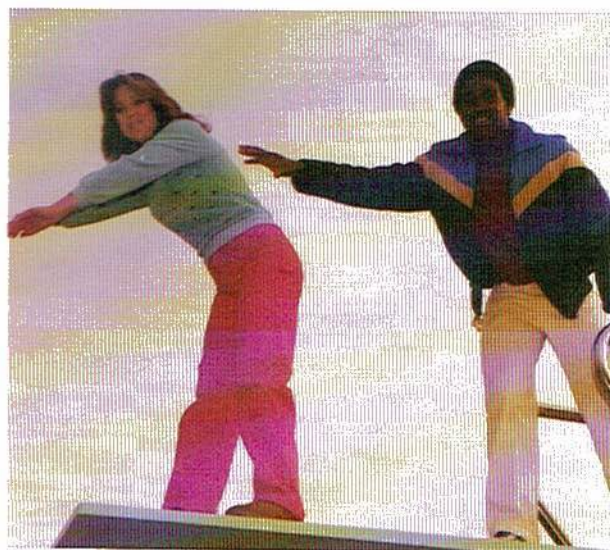
